What is the census?

- The census is the most important statistical survey conducted every five years.
- It covers all persons and households (including non-Japanese) living in Japan.

What are the census data used for?

The census data is used as a basis for various administrative measures.

The census data forms the legal population serving as a basis of Japan's population, e.g., drawing boundaries of electoral districts, calculating the tax allocated to local governments. Other census data, such as population by gender/age group, daytime population, household composition (households with elderly persons, etc.), and population by industry, are used as basic data for various kinds of measures by the national and local governments, including social welfare, employment, environmental improvement, and disaster recovery. The census data is also widely used by the private sector in various areas.

Census data is used for parenting support.
